October Luncheon features Harris & England



The Government and Legislative Committee is proud to present two of our district legislators at the October luncheon scheduled for Wednesday, October 17th at 11:30 a.m. in the beautiful Ruthe Jackson Center.

Senator Chris Harris serves District 9 which includes Grand Prairie. Senator Chris Harris has served in the Texas Senate since January 1991. His interests include promoting economic growth, improving the quality of care for aged or disabled Texans, supporting institutions of higher education, improving our environment, and increasing child support enforcement.

Senator Harris currently has the pleasure of serving on four committees; State Affairs, Jurisprudence, Government Organization, and the Veteran Affairs and Military Installations Committee. During the 2003 and 2005 Texas Legislature, Lieutenant Governor Dewhurst appointed Senator Harris as Chairman of the Senate Administration Committee. Senator Harris was honored to serve in this capacity during these Legislative Sessions and focused on improving the internal operations of the Texas Senate.

Representative Kirk England was elected in a special election to the House of Representatives on February 28, 2006. After being reelected in 2006, Representative England had the privilege of being appointed to the prestigious House Committee on Appropriations. Budget items included:

- * increased funding for public education by almost \$4 billion
- * \$137 million to improve and restore Texas Parks
- * healthcare access to more than 127,000 additional children
- * fought for a 13th annuity check to retired educators
- * allocating \$103 million to protect our borders
- * \$14.3 billion for property tax relief
- * \$2.5 billion to restore State Savings Account-Rainy Day Fund

During the 80th Legislative Session, Representative England proudly co-sponsored House Bill 109, which gave eligible children additional means to join the Texas Children's Health Insurance Program, an issue that Mr. England holds dear to him. Additionally, Mr. England worked along side of his colleagues on passing vital legislation regarding funding of cancer research, House Bill 14. Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas will issue grants to universities and private research facilities throughout Texas for prevention control and research. This legislation makes Texas a world leader in research and eradicating cancer for future Texans.

Books Needed for Chamber / USO Project

Last year, Chamber members gave generously to our first ever "Thanks Giving" project. Childrens books were collected and presented to the USO Reading Room at DFW Airport. There, soldiers who are returning to active duty after two weeks of R&R, are given the opportunity to read a story for their children and have it video-recorded. The USO then mails the book and DVD back to the soldier's family.

The book and the DVD become treasure for the children who wouldn't normally be able to see and hear their parent reading a bedtime story.

The Chamber's Board of Directors has chosen to repeat the project again this year. At the November 14th luncheon (45 days from now) we will shower the USO Reading Room with hundreds of books to help keep this valuable program going year round. An average of 200 soldiers are deployed via the DFW Airport daily, so thousands of books per year are required to meet the need.

Board of Director's Meeting
August 2007

Ex-Officio Reports: **Shana Nix:** Ms. Nix reported all playgrounds have now been repaired. She also noted the delay on the Arlington Football stadiums turf has caused several football games to be moved. In regards to the death of a player in Mansfield, she noted that all Arlington facilities have defibrillators on campus and in the athletic departments.

Paul Gramza, Great Southwest Industrial District Association: The GSWIDA will host a networking event with the Airhogs on September 20th from 5 - 7 pm, and all businesses were invited. The Association is also organizing a Business Crime Watch in the Highway 360 / I-30 corridor. To date over 19 businesses have expressed interest and joined in that effort. The Association will host a golf tournament on Monday, October 22.

**Arlington Memorial Hospital opens the new
 Tom Vandergriff Tower**

November 15 marks the completion of Arlington Memorial Hospital's (AMH's) new surgical tower. The \$76-million project, which began in January 2006, adds 200,000 square feet and 48 private patient rooms to the hospital, making it the largest expansion in AMH's history.

Along with additional patient rooms, the tower will house 16 surgical suites, equipped with the most advanced technology available, including high-definition screens where surgeons can reference the patient's diagnostic imaging as they work.

The new tower also includes the little things that make surgery less stressful, such as private prep rooms where patients can stay with their family members before surgery and wireless access, so patients and their visitors can use laptops and PDAs.

The tower's grand opening festivities provide an opportunity for residents to tour the facility and see, firsthand, how AMH is meeting the growing need for quality health care in Arlington, Mansfield and the surrounding area.

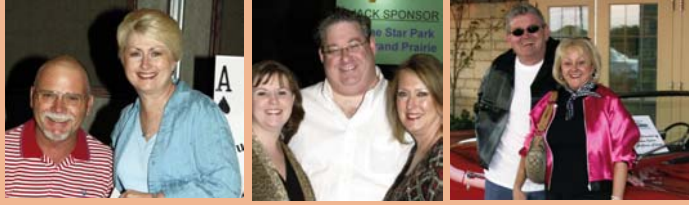

Grand Prairie Police Department Earns CALEA Accreditation
GP Police among 19 CALEA accredited law enforcement agencies in Texas, 600 nationwide

The Grand Prairie Police Department now stands as one of only 19 law enforcement agencies in Texas and 600 nationwide as an accredited law enforcement agency by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA).

"We have proven to ourselves and to our community that we are among the best," said Grand Prairie Police Chief Glen Hill. "It is now our challenge to continue to demonstrate our commitment to this profession."

During Grand Prairie Police Department's three year accreditation process, all aspects of the department's policies, procedures, management, operations and support services were examined in detail by CALEA. The Grand Prairie Police Department also conducted a detailed self-assessment and participated in an on-site review by a team of outside CALEA assessors. CALEA accredited law enforcement agencies meet a body of professional standards and are required to maintain those standards demonstrating excellence in the profession of law enforcement.

To complete the process, Grand Prairie Police Chief Glen Hill and Lieutenant Larry Simmons appeared before a panel of CALEA Commissioners, who conducted a final review. On July 28, the entire CALEA Board of Commissioners unanimously voted to award the Grand Prairie Police Department accreditation status.

New NTTA toll rates are now in effect. Commuters who currently pay cash on local toll roads may want to consider getting a TollTag to save money and time.

Effective September 29th, cash customers now pay 40% more than TollTag customers. Plus, with an electronic TollTag you may enjoy the convenience of managing your account on-line and not having to search for cash to pay a toll. In addition, your TollTag allows you to breeze through the express lane at local toll booths, including DFW Airport and Love Field Airport.

Rates at the Mountain Creek Lake Bridge and the Addison Airport Toll Tunnel will remain unchanged at 50 cents.
